Operational Considerations – Parks

Phase 1

- Signage and public communication for park visitors
 - Continue to practicing social distancing
 - Face coverings recommended
 - If you are sick, please stay home
 - Besides bringing water with you to the parks, please bring hand sanitizer or non-toxic wipes for your personal use
 - Please dispose of any used masks, gloves, or wipes in trash receptacles.
- Outdoor Facility Use Applications for athletic field permitted use may be considered effective June 10, 2020
 - When issuing permits, alternate field assignments to extend physical distancing
- In order to receive approved permit for field use, league representatives will be required to monitor and enforce the following guidelines, with the understanding that any violations will result in permit being revoked and potential denial of future field use applications:
 - Participation only allowed if you are fever free and have had no signs or symptoms in the past 72 hours
 - Physical distancing required (6 feet or more)
 - Groups of 10 or less per field (including all coaches and players)
 - Diamond = 1 field
 - Multipurpose field can be split into two even halves = 2 fields
 - No shared equipment
 - Avoid use of benches and dugouts
 - If multiple practices are held, they must be scheduled at least 15 minutes apart to reduce potential for transition time gathering
 - Spectators must remain in or at their vehicles, in designated parking areas

Phase 2

- Consider signage and public communication for park visitors
 - Continue to practicing social distancing
 - Face coverings recommended
 - If you are sick, please stay home
 - Besides bringing water with you to the parks, please bring hand sanitizer or non-toxic wipes for your personal use
 - Please dispose of any used masks, gloves, or wipes in trash receptacles.
- Athletic field scheduling
 - When scheduling, alternate field assignments to extend physical distancing
- In order to receive approved permit for field use, league representatives will be required to monitor and enforce the following guidelines, with the understanding that any violations will result in permit being revoked and potential denial of future field use applications:
 - Participation only allowed if you are fever free and have had no signs or symptoms in the past 72 hours
 - Moderate physical distancing required
 - Groups of 50 or less per field (including all coaches and players and spectators)
 - Diamond = 1 field
 - Multipurpose field can be split into two even halves = 2 fields
 - No shared equipment
 - Avoid use of benches and dugouts

- If multiple practices/games are held, they must be scheduled at least 30 minutes apart to reduce potential for transition time gathering

Phase 3

- Permanent restroom facilities should be equipped with necessary self-serve cleaning supplies
- Upon reopening restroom facilities
 - Follow CDC guidance for cleaning and disinfecting: <https://www.cdc.gov/coronavirus/2019-ncov/community/disinfecting-building-facility.html>
 - Additional hand sanitizer and individual dispensable disinfecting wipes for patrons to wipe touchable surfaces
- Athletic field scheduling
 - When scheduling, alternate field assignments to extend physical distancing
- League representatives will be required to monitor and enforce the following guidelines, with the understanding that any violations will result in permit revocation and potential denial of future field use applications:
 - Participation only allowed if you are fever free and have had no signs or symptoms in the past 72 hours
 - Recommended physical distancing required
 - Groups of 250 or less per permitted field (including all coaches, players and spectators)
